
On a hill behind the Rockbridge Farmers' Co-op sits a faded green and yellow building. The old-fashioned sign advertises Kenney's, "home of the special sauce burgers and great chicken." The restaurant, also known as Kenney Burger, serves southern fare like fried chicken and biscuits, as well as thick milkshakes, hamburgers, and sandwiches.

Before there was Kenney's, there was Biff-Burger, a chain of drive-in restaurants that sold the original sauce burgers, broiled burgers, and thick milkshakes. During the middle of the twentieth century, Bill Kenney owned several Biff-Burger locations. He then founded his own restaurant chain and renamed the restaurants he already owned.

There are no more Biff-Burgers in Virginia, but Kenney's continues to sell classic Biff-Burger treats like sauce burgers and thick milkshakes.

Besides the Lexington location, there are only two other Kenney Burgers left in Virginia: one in Roanoke and one in Buena Vista. Still, the chain has left its mark on Virginia grocery stores: you can find its special sauce on Kroger shelves as a fundraiser for Habitat for Humanity.
